







Boundary Fence


Property Boundary

Use native shrubs and wildflowers to attract birds, butterflies and bees.

	Spider Lily <i>Crinum pedunculatum</i>	Fragrant white flowers: 	Stingless Native Bees <i>Tetragonula sp.</i> 
	Common Everlasting, Yellow Buttons <i>Chrysocephalum apiculatum</i>	Yellow flowers: 	Australian Painted Lady <i>Vanessa kershawi</i> 
	Golden Everlasting Daisy <i>Xerochrysum bracteatum</i>	Yellow flowers: 	Attracts butterflies and native bees
	Angular Pigface, Iceplant <i>Carpobrotus glaucescens</i>	Flowers Pink-purple: 	Attracts native bees
	Eumundi Quandong, <i>Elaeocarpus eumundi</i> Tall narrow growth – use as screen tree instead of bamboo	Flowers white-pink: 	Eastern Bronze Flat butterfly <i>Netrocoryne repanda</i> Upside-down flowers retain nectar for birds in rainy weather.

Curbside

Curbside plantings must allow access from vehicles to footpath or an unestablished pedestrian path. Native grasses and wildflowers will feed butterflies and birds.
